


Places to Visit in Champaran

MAHATMA GANDHI SMARAK/ GANDHI SANGHRAHALAYA.

Mahatma Gandhi Smarak/ Gandhi Sanghrahala. This memorial pillar has been designed by the famous artist of Santiniketan Mr. Nand Lal Bose to commemorate the memory of Champaran Satyagah of Mahatma Gandhi who first raised voice against the atrocities of the British Indigo planters against poor peasants of Champaran.



KESARIYA STUPA



Kesariya Stupa is an ancient Buddhist stupa located at Kesariya in East Champaran district of Bihar. Kesariya is at a distance of 110 km from Patna. It is estimated that its construction started in the 3rd century BC. The circumference of this stupa is 120 meters and the height is approximately 32 meters. So far it is estimated to be the tallest excavated stupa in the world.

VALMIKI TIGER RESERVE

Valmiki National Park is located in West Champaran district. In the north, it is bordered by Nepal's Chitwan National Park and in the west by Uttar Pradesh. Its total forest area comprises about 900 km² (350 sq mi), out of which the Valmiki Wildlife Sanctuary is 880 km² (340 sq mi) and spread of the National Park is about 335 km² (129 sq mi) area.



THE INDIA-NEPAL BORDER



The India–Nepal border is an open international boundary running between the republics of India and Nepal. The 1,770 km (1,099.83 mi) long border includes the Himalayan territories as well as Indo-Gangetic Plain of the subcontinent. The current border was delimited after the Sugauli treaty of 1816 between Nepal and the British Raj. Following Indian independence, the prevailing border was recognised as the international border between the Kingdom of Nepal and the Dominion of India.

SHREE SOMESHWAR NATH MAHADEV MANDIR

The history of Areraj Temple dates back to around 2000 years, founded by King Som, hence it's called Someshwarnath Mahadev Temple. According to mythology, Lord Rama and Mother Sita stayed here while returning from Janakpur and worshiped Lord Shiva. As per the Skanda Purana, the Panchamukhi Shivling in the temple is self-manifested and was established by Chandra (the Moon God).

TAKHT SRI PATNA SAHIB

Takht Sri Patna Sahib is one of the five sacred Takhts (seats of authority) in Sikhism. It marks the birthplace of Guru Gobind Singh Ji, the tenth Sikh Guru. BODH GAYA




Bodh Gaya is one of the holiest sites in Buddhism. It is here, under the Bodhi Tree, that Lord Buddha attained enlightenment. The Mahabodhi Temple, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, attracts pilgrims and tourists from all over the world, offering spiritual peace and architectural grandeur.

NALANDA UNIVERSITY RUINS

Once the world's first residential university, Nalanda flourished from the 5th to the 12th century CE. Today, its ruins tell stories of scholarly brilliance and cultural exchange. The site includes monasteries, temples, and a museum showcasing rare manuscripts and artifacts.



PAWAPURI



The Pawapuri Jal Mandir (Water Temple) in Nalanda, Bihar, is a stunning white marble Jain temple built in the middle of a lotus-filled pond, marking where Lord Mahavira attained moksha (liberation) and was cremated. Connected by a stone bridge, it's a serene, sacred pilgrimage site dedicated to Mahavira, housing his Charan Paduka (footprints), and is famous for its beautiful architecture and tranquil setting with red lotuses.

RAJGIR "THE CITY OF KINGS"

Rajgir, old name Rajagriha, meaning "The City of Kings," is an ancient city and university town in the Nalanda district of Bihar, India. Also a Cultural capital of magadh. It was the capital of the Haryanka dynasty, the Pradyota dynasty, the Brihadratha dynasty, the Mauryan Empire, and it was the retreat center for the Buddha and his sangha. Other historical figures such as Mahavira and king Bimbisara lived there, and due to its religious significance, the city holds a place of prominence in Hindu, Buddhist and Jain scriptures.
